RCV Fund-giving Lunch a Rousing Success

Here's a brief summary of the three pitches and the final outcome.

Pitch #1: Establish a junior rugby club in Mernda

One of Melbourne's largest population growth corridors is to the north of the CBD and includes the Cities of Hume and Whittlesea. Between them, these two LGA have a current population of over half a million people, with 50%+ growth expected over the next 15 years. And yet the area has no rugby club, despite a significant rugby loving migrant population.

Northern Rugby Club, with support from Academy Movement's new Mernda Central College Rugby Academy are looking to establish a new junior's program based initially at Mernda Central College.

The program would draw on the existing club processes and procedures of one of Melbourne's established clubs (Northern Panthers), but be based in a location within 10 minutes' drive of hundreds of kids looking to play club rugby.

With \$10k of funding from The Rugby Club of Victoria for the purchase of jerseys, training & playing equipment and ground hire, the new program aims to enter an u14 (boys and girls) and u16s boys team in the Rugby Vic competition in 2025 and grow from there.

Pitch #2: Run an off-season contact & non-contact junior rugby program

The Eastern Renegades, an amalgamation of four Eastern suburbs clubs, are looking to establish an off-season junior rugby competition that keeps kids playing and having fun, while providing an opportunity for families looking to try out the sport and see if rugby is right for them, without committing to a whole season.

Run in a gala day, carnival format, with music, face-painting, BBQ & ice-cream vans, the comp would aim at boys & girls up to u12, with three to four gala days over the 2024/25 summer, playing touch or modified tackle games as interest and conditions allow.

Thanks to a very generous donor, The Rugby Club of Victoria will also provide \$10k of initial funding towards this idea but we are also asking members to support this initiative with a further funding to make the program free or very low cost to participate.

Pitch #3: Run a pre-season tournament for U10 and below

While there are a number of pre-season tournaments available for u12 and up age groups, no such tournament is currently offered for younger age groups. This is a highly competitive end of the sports market and others like basketball and AFL use pre-season comps to build commitment and sign-ups.

Thanks to a very generous donor, The Rugby Club of Victoria will provide \$5k of funding to help Powerhouse Rugby Club establish a preseason tournament for age grades up to u10, run over a weekend in March/April 2025. Teams from all over Victoria will be invited to what is expected to be a celebration of junior rugby, with hundreds of boys and girls competing and having fun. It will also provide an opportunity to bring together junior coaches and referees to build connections and cooperation going into the new season.

This initiative is a nice flow-on from Idea #2 and is hoped will provide a way for families to try (and get hooked on) rugby before committing to other winter sports. RCV is looking to members to help raise a further funding to make the program free or at very low cost to participants.

With \$25k committed to these new ideas to grow rugby in Victoria, the total amount invested by RCV's generous members since our founding four years ago is now in excess of \$100,000.


